

**HEALTH AND SOCIAL CONDITION REPORT ON THE CHILD ADOPTED IN GEORGIA**

1. Name and surname of the child before adoption

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2. Name and surname of the child after adoption

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3. Date of Birth (day-month-year)

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4. Personal identity number or birth certificate issued in Georgia

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5. Health report or complete diagnosis of the Child (main disease, accompanying disease, any complication)

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6. Any diseases in the past

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7. Short anamnesis

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8. Diagnostic examination and consultation (Pediatrician, neurologist, surgery, orthopedic traumatologist, otolaryngology, ophthalmologist etc.)

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9. Current disease (if applicable)

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10. In case of decease, the reasons for the death (conclusion of the expert)

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11. A course of medical treatment undertaken

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12. Vaccinations

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13. Medications taken by the child

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14. Surgical treatments (including planned treatments) and examinations.

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15. Recommendations

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16. Assessment of psychometric development

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17. Assessment of cognitive and emotional development (skills, habits, inclinations, character peculiarities)

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18. Any problems with the family, educational institution or adaptation to the environments.

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19. Education provided (in case of a student, the name of the collage/school/institute and the level/year of the course)

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20. Any problems with the social, lingual and emotional issues

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21. What information does the child have concerning the State of Origin ( Culture, religion, language, traditions)

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22. What kind of information does he /she have (positive/negative) on the adoption , and his/her opinion

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23. The authority, issuing this document

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24. Signature of the competent person of the State of Origin Central Authority (in case of non existence of Central Authority in the Receiving State, of the licensed or accredited organization).

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Note: In case of intercountry adoption, the Central Authority is obliged to request, from the Central Authority of the Receiving country (in case of non-existence of such body – with the licensed or/and accredited relevant authorized organization) to annually submit information about the health and social condition of the child adopted from Georgia, in compliance with the special form, until the adopted child is 18 years old.
